Break-out Sessions to discuss church library software

“I didn’t know the program could do that!” “That will save me so much time!” “Wonderful!” We expect these are comments you’ll make! As you know, it is invaluable to be able to talk with others who use the same software. At the fall workshop there will be a block of time for each “user group” to meet and discuss every-day use and enhancements of church library software programs, e.g. ResourceMate, Library Thing, Library World, and Surpass. So bring both questions and solutions to share. Listening in on one of these discussions will also be helpful to individuals considering automation.

Glen Cary Lutheran Church derives its name from the town of Glen Carey which was settled in 1856. A few houses were built; a bill was introduced in the state legislature to make Glen Carey the seat of Anoka County. Opposition of the citizens of Anoka prevailed however, and the bill was defeated. Sometime later a prairie fire

swept through the area, leveling the town and leaving its name to be preserved only in the name of the church.

The congregation itself was established on October 24, 1870. Early settlers were predominantly Norwegian and Swedish. In the first years, “meetings” were held in homes. In 1873 space was cleared, timbers hauled in by oxen and construction of the first church building located just north of the present building was begun.

As the congregation grew throughout the years, the little white church started to bulge at the seams. In 1960 the present church structure was completed with two remodelings and additions that now give us our present church building.

Directions to Glen Cary Lutheran Church

From the South:

Hwy 35W to Exit 32 (95th Avenue, toward National Sports Center)

At top of exit, take a right onto 95th Avenue, which turns into Radisson Road.

Stay on Radisson Road to Bunker Lake Blvd (about 7.1 miles)

Turn left onto Bunker Lake Blvd NE. (go about 1 mile)

Turn right onto Highway 65 N (about 2 miles)

Turn left onto 153rd Avenue NE (384 ft.)

At stop sign, turn right onto Central Avenue NE.


Glen Cary Lutheran Church will be on the right side. There are two parking lots, one on the south side and another on the north side church.

From the North


Follow Highway 65 south to 157th Avenue NE. Turn right.

Books Worth a Look



The Tutor's Daughter - Julie Klassen

When her widowed father agrees to tutor a baronet's four sons, Emma finds herself living in a grand Cornwall manor---and confronting an eerie mystery. Who's sneaking into her room at night? Who tears a page from her journal, only to return it with a chilling illustration? Can she identify the culprit before it's too late?

Manuscript Found In Accra - Paulo Coelho

Coelho's quietly beautiful book is difficult to categorize. Unlike many of his novels, it is not an allegory, nor does it revolve around a mystical or physical pilgrimage. Instead, it consists of a series of queries posed by a population under siege and the powerfully simple, yet evocative, answers provided by an essentially unidentified wise man. As Jerusalem is surrounded by belligerent Crusaders in AD 1099, its diverse citizens—Jews, Muslims, and Christians, who have lived together in peace for centuries—gather in the square to seek the counsel of the Greek, known familiarly as the Copt. The Copt advises them to speak of their daily lives and search their hearts, minds, and souls for questions pertaining to universal truths. As the Copt thoughtfully answers questions posed about a variety of everyday subjects, including solitude, love, utility, luck, miracles, beauty, sex, anxiety, grace, and elegance, he bequeaths to his audience an “invisible sword” with which to fight intolerance and ignorance. **HIGH-DEMAND**
